#### Did you know?

- Up to 70% of women who are abused before pregnancy are abused during pregnancy.
- Women who are abused during pregnancy are twice as likely to delay prenatal care.
- Pregnant teens between 15 and 19 are more at risk for homicide than any other age group.
- Up to 50% of adolescent mothers experience intimate partner violence before, during, or just after their pregnancy.
- Children born to abused mothers are 30% more likely to require intensive care at birth & 17% more likely to be born underweight.
